Editorial Rules for pictures

Images

Authors can illustrate their articles with images and/or diagrams. All images will be printed in black and white, even if sent in colour.

Images

All images and diagrams should be sent <u>each one as a separate image files</u> (*.raw, *.jpg, *.png, *.tiff or other formats) and in high resolution (at least 300 dpi) and numbered in the exact order in which they will appear in the article (N. 1, N. 2 etc.). All the Jpeg files will be collected into a zipped folder "Images", which can be sent via email to the Editor roberto.sani@unimc.it.

Tables

As for tables, please make sure that the textual contents are perfectly readable before sending.

Position of images inside the text

Authors are asked *not to include* the images inside the text.

Authors should send – in addition to the article's main text, and the zipped folder "Images" – a further Word-file containing all the captions, each one correctly numbered (N. 1, N. 2 etc.) in the exact order in which the images will appear in the article.

As for the position of images, it is enough for Authors to write, in bold type, the words: **[Pict. n. 1]**, or **[Tab. n. 1]**... etc., in the exact point of the article's main text where the images should be inserted. The publisher will arrange the right insertion.

Iconographical References

Each image should be equipped with the clear mention of the title/subject, but also with the mention of the exact source, i.e.:

- image taken from a published book:

- a private picture, whose reproduction has been authorized by the author:

Pictures nn. 34: The jury, chaired by Giuseppe Flores d'Arcais, of the 1985 edition of the *European Award of Youth's Literature* since then entitled to the Humanist Pier Paolo Vergerius – at work in the Critical Library Room (provided by kind permission of A.M. Bernardinis).

Photographs taken with a digital camera

Please keep in mind that in order to take a photo with a digital camera which will give a good quality print, you need a different megapixel resolution, according to the measures of your image, as in the following table of specifications:

| Camera | Pixel | Image's dimensions |
|-------------|-----------|--------------------|
| 2 megapixel | 1600x1200 | 13,5 x 10,2 cm |
| 3 megapixel | 2048x1536 | 17,3 x 13,0 cm |
| 4 megapixel | 2272x1704 | 19,2 x 14,4 cm |
| 5 megapixel | 2560x1920 | 21,7 x 16,3 cm |
| 6 megapixel | 3000x2000 | 25,4 x 16,9 cm |

Remember that, regardless of the high resolution used during the shot, that it will also be necessary to save the images again, with your software, e.g. Photoshop, using a resolution mode (just select 300 dpi option).
